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






Dakota in 1982. It weighed 3,591 pounds and it required 8,000 people to polish it off.

A Brief History of Burgers

The origin of the hamburger is more mystery than history. One version claims that hamburger, or "Filet de boeuf de Hambourgeoise," found its way from Europe to Boston where it first appeared on restaurant menus in 1874. Another source claims that the modern hamburger was invented in the 1880's by Fletcher Davis at his café in Athens, Texas, Yet another story claims that the first hamburgers were served

at Louis Lassen's New Haven sandwich shop in 1895. And



some food scholars claim that the first hamburger patty on a bun was served at Drexel's Pure Food Restaurant in Chicago in 1917.

Most people agree that wherever it was invented, the American version of the hamburger made its international debut at the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis, along with the ice cream cone. Although we'll probably never know which story is true, one thing you can believe is that a fresh, made-to-order Kidd Valley burger will make you forget all the controversy and simply be glad that someone somewhere invented it.



Origins of the Kidd

Kidd Valley's made-to-order burgers and hand-mixed shakes can be traced back



to the fishing trips founder John Morris took with his father as a youngster. A favorite spot for Morris's family was Camp Kid, an old logging camp at the base of Mt. St. Helens,

which was located near a primitive 1950's general store that served freshly-made burgers and delicious milkshakes. Morris's fondness for the tasty burgers and shakes served up at the general store stuck with him into his adult years.

Those memories were triggered within Morris one day in 1975, when he spotted a "For Sale" sign in the window of a former Dairy Delight in Seattle's U-District.

Realizing that Seattle had yet to establish its own specialty hamburger and milkshake tradition, Morris opened Seattle's first Kidd Valley hamburger restaurant in 1975 at 5502 25th Ave NE. Morris sold his Kidd Valley restaurants to Ivar's in 1989, which has continued with his vision of freshly prepared burgers, sandwiches, side orders and hand-mixed milkshakes.

Fun Fact

The company's original "Burger Babe" logo was replaced at the turn of the century by the Kidd carrying the burger. But, the Burger Babe still hides around the restaurants. Can you find her?
